Proclamation

May 2017 60TH ANNIVERSARY MEMORIAL HOSPTIAL AUXILIARY

WHEREAS, in the spring and summer of 1957 a group of local women had the foresight to see the need for a Women's Auxiliary in anticipation of the new Memorial Hospital opening; and

WHEREAS, on May 9, 1957 Memorial Hospital Auxiliary was formed; and

WHEREAS, Memorial Hospital Auxiliary's charter membership closed on December 31, 1957 with a total of 1,488 members; and

WHEREAS, on May 19, 1958 Memorial Hospital admitted its first patient and 27 Auxilians assumed their respective duties which included assistance in the Surgical, Medical and Pediatric Departments and in Dental Supply, the Gift Shop, Business Office. Volunteer Office. Hostess Desk and cashiers in the Cafeteria; and

WHEREAS, Memorial Hospital Auxiliary's membership now includes many gentlemen and junior volunteers, formerly known as candy stripers; and

WHEREAS, Memorial Hospital Auxiliary has brought cheer to Memorial Convalescent Center residents by hosting games and parties for the residents throughout the year and on holidays; and

WHEREAS, Memorial Hospital Auxilians have always been a valuable resource, from sewing the first curtains for the original hospital to the on-going fund-raising efforts to purchase state-of-the-art equipment and the countless hours volunteered so that the residents of Southwest Illinois have the best healthcare services available; and

WHEREAS, Memorial Hospital Auxiliary has donated 9 million dollars and 2.8 million service hours to the Hospital and Convalescent Center; and

WHEREAS, Memorial Hospital Auxiliary is celebrating their 60th Anniversary and we remember those who played an important part in establishing the Auxiliary and those carrying on the tradition.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT PROCLAIMED that I, Mark A. Kern, County Board Chairman, do hereby congratulate MEMORIAL HOSPITAL AUXILIARY on their 60th Anniversary and thank them for their outstanding community service.

History

of the Memorial Hospital Auxiliary



In the spring and summer of 1957, a group of Belleville women had a vision to contribute to the community by organizing an auxiliary to serve Memorial Hospital, a new healthcare center then under construction for residents of the surrounding communities. May 9, 1957, marked the birth of this organization. Auxiliary members walked door to door selling cardboard bricks for one dollar to raise funds for the new hospital. Once Memorial was built, volunteers sewed and hung curtains throughout the hospital.

Sixty years later, that initial burst of enthusiasm and success is still evident and continues to make Memorial Hospital Auxiliary a strong and viable force in the hospital and community.

The charter membership closed on December 31, 1957, with a total of 1,488 members. The Auxiliary has maintained a strong and dedicated membership, currently standing at 590. Over 325 of those members are actively involved in some way to benefit Memorial and the patients we serve.

Our membership now includes many men as well as junior volunteers.

May 18, 1958, marked Dedication Day for Memorial Hospital, with the first patient being admitted on May 19. Volunteer service has always been the prime focus for the Auxiliary, starting on the opening day when 27 Auxilians assumed their respective duties. Six Pink Angels were assigned to the surgical, medical, and pediatric departments; the remaining 21 volunteers assisted in dental supply, laboratory, gift shop, business office, volunteer office, and hostess desk and acted as cashiers in the cafeteria. As of December 31, 2016, volunteer service hours totaled nearly 2.8 million with financial support of over \$9 million.

Memorial's Auxiliary currently has 11 charter members, and two are still actively involved with the Auxiliary and its projects. Pearl Spies has recorded the most volunteer hours with 15,655. Caroline Busse still volunteers time to the organization.

Several volunteers have worked with the Illinois Hospital Association Constituency on Volunteers, a state organization educating auxiliaries throughout the state.

The Auxiliary's Educational Assistance program helps our employees achieve certification in all disciplines of hospital work through reimbursement of their tuition. Nearly \$1 million has been given to students and employees through this program since its inception.

The list of everything Memorial's Auxiliary does for our patients, visitors, employees, and physicians could go on and on. Suffice it to say, this is a group of truly dedicated volunteers who give of their time, talent, and expertise selflessly. We truly appreciate all that they do.

The quilters also made tab blankets that featured fluffy, bumpy, pastel fabric and ribbon tabs sewn around all four edges. Plus, they gave one of their unique quilts to the first baby born at Memorial Hospital East in Shiloh.

Although they didn't keep track of all the quilts they made, the group has crafted hundreds over the last 33 years.
