
Mr. Turner is the third president in Memorial's history, and during his tenure, he has led significant growth at Memorial, including:

Under Mr. Turner's leadership, Memorial Hospital Belleville received Magnet designation in 2008 and has had two subsequent successful re-designations, along with the initial Magnet designation of Memorial Hospital East in 2018. Only 6% of hospitals nationwide achieve this designation. He also played an integral role guiding Memorial's integration with BJC HealthCare, one of the largest nonprofit health care organizations in the country. Mr. Turner — congratulations on a job well done during your tenure at Memorial. We wish you all the best in your retirement!

Disposal of Expired **Medications**


Memorial Hospital Auxiliary collects unused or expired drugs or health supplements. The **Environmental Services** Department disposes of


Reading plays an important role in helping to secure a child's future, and with your help, we will give children an educational boost during a pivotal point in their reading education.



Coronavirus

Due to the expanding travel restrictions related to COVID-19, BJC is broadening restrictions for volunteers. Any volunteers who have traveled outside the United States to areas with community transmission or have been exposed to a suspected or confirmed case of COVID-19 in the previous 14 days cannot work in a BJC facility. They may start 15 days after they have returned to the United States or 15 days after potential

exposure, provided they do not have any of the following symptoms: fever, cough or trouble breathing. Current COVID-19 Transmission Areas include China (Hubei Province, transmission occurring country-wide); Italy (Northern Italy, particularly Lombardy); South Korea (Southern South Korea, particularly Daegu). Other areas with community transmission include Hong Kong, Iran and Japan.
