Established by Congress in 2000, the Moment of Remembrance asks Americans to pause for one minute at 1500 (3 p.m.) local time to remember and honor those who have died in service to the country. This moment of silence is meant to unite the country in a shared expression of gratitude and respect for those who have made the ultimate sacrifice.

As we welcome the month of May, we'd like to take a moment to recognize the incredible work of our hospital auxiliary volunteers who have been tirelessly supporting our patients and staff



throughout the year. From organizing fundraising events to providing comfort to patients and their families, our hospital auxiliary plays a vital role in making our hospital a caring and supportive community. Thank you, Denise, Carol and all our amazing Memorial volunteers. We appreciate you!




# Gift Shop
