Radiology Assistant - Shiloh



Evolve Weapons Detection System Installation

To further promote the BJC value of Safety, Memorial has installed an Evolv Weapons Detection System at its Shiloh Campus Emergency Department entrance. Installation of this system took place Tuesday, August 1. All staff members who enter through the Shiloh ED entrance are required to go through the weapons detection device along with our patients and visitors. There are no exceptions.

The implementation of this advanced security technology is part of our ongoing commitment to upgrade our systems and advance the safety and security of our employees and patients. The weapons detection system will be installed later this year at the Belleville Campus Emergency Department.
