President's Message:

Last month, we discussed resilience and how it can positively affect our lives personally and professionally. This month, I would like to introduce the concept of mindfulness and its potential benefits. Mindfulness is defined as a mental practice and a form of meditation that involves being fully present in the moment, paying attention to your thoughts, feelings and sensations without judgement. It is a simple tool that can be used in your daily life, including volunteer work, to enhance your well-being and the overall hospital experience. Some of the key benefits of practicing mindfulness include:

- 1. **Stress reduction**: Mindfulness has been shown to reduce stress and anxiety, allowing you to better manage the demands of your volunteer work and personal life.
- 2. **Improved focus:** By practicing mindfulness, you can enhance your ability to concentrate on tasks, making your interactions with patients and their families more meaningful and attentive.
- 3. **Enhanced empathy:** Mindfulness cultivates compassion and empathy, helping you better understand the emotions and needs of patients and families, which can lead to more effective support and care.
- 4. **Resilience:** Developing mindfulness skills can increase your resilience, allowing you to bounce back from challenging situations with greater ease and grace.
- 5. **Better communication:** Mindfulness improves communication skills, helping you to convey information and provide comfort to patients and families more effectively.

To get started with mindfulness, consider these simple practices:

1. **Breathing exercises:** Take a few moments to focus on your breathing. Inhale deeply through your nose

and exhale slowly through your mouth. This can help you stay grounded in the present moment.

- 2. **Mindful walking:** When walking in the hospital or around its premises, pay attention to each step you take. Feel the sensation of your feet hitting the ground.
- 3. **Body Scan:** Every now and then, check in with your body. Lie on your back with your legs extended and your arms at your sides, palms up. Focus your attention slowly and deliberately on each part of your body, in order, from toe to head or head to toe. Be aware of any sensations, emotions or thoughts associated with each part of your body. Notice any areas of tension or discomfort, and consciously release the tension.
- 4. **Mindful Listening:** During conversations with patients or coworkers, practice active listening. Give your full attention without thinking about what to say next.
- 5. **Daily reflection:** At the end of your volunteering shift, take a few minutes to reflect on your experiences and how mindfulness may have influenced them.

Explore mindfulness at your own pace and integrate it into your volunteer work. You will likely discover its transformative effects not only on your own well-being but also on the lives of those you touch with your kindness and presence. Together, we can create a more compassionate and healing environment for everyone at our hospitals. Thank you again for your dedication and service.

Volunteers Needed


Radiology Assistant - Shiloh

Standardized, Simplified Non-Clinical Emergency Response Notifications Now Live

With core Values of Safety and Excellence, BJC continuously looks for more effective ways to keep staff and patients safe at all our hospitals.

To simplify messaging and create consistency across BJC hospitals, a new systemwide policy will institute standardized non-clinical emergency notifications in clear, plain language across BJC hospitals. The policy will be implemented Sept. 18 systemwide, in conjunction with National Preparedness Month and BJC's "Healthcare Emergency Management Week."

Currently BJC hospitals frequently use different words, terms or color codes to describe non-clinical emergencies, such as "code red" for a fire or "code white" for trained security assistance needed. This lack of clarity and consistency creates additional burdens that can contribute to confusion for employees who work at multiple BJC hospitals.

Standardizing notification messaging for non-clinical emergencies will provide consistency to increase readiness, reduce confusion, promote rapid action across all stakeholder groups, and ease transitions between campuses. Under the new policy, BJC will initiate the use of plain language messaging that conveys the situation requiring a response.

"These standard, plain-language terms are easier for staff to understand and respond to during non-clinical emergencies such as a fire, utility interruption, patient elopement, hazardous weather, crime, mass casualty and more," says Mike Lauer, BJC executive director of emergency preparedness, environmental safety and security. "Using standard, plain language across all our hospitals will give all staff a better understanding of when a situation arises and what that situation is. There will be no need for a quick mental process to translate 'code silver' into what the event is and what kind of response is needed."
